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## Aquatic Facility Negotiations to Commence

A decision by Council to enter negotiations with a consortium led by Western Recreation and Pro-bilt Structures brings the construction of a new aquatic centre for Kindersley one step closer.

At a Special Meeting of Council Tuesday night, Council voted unanimously to move forward, approving the consortium as the successful proponent out of seven firms that made submissions for the design and construction of a new aquatic facility. Mayor Rod Perkins and Chief Administrative Officer Bernie Morton were directed to proceed with contract negotiations to build an indoor aquatic facility adjacent to the West Central Events Centre (WCEC).

The design and costs for the new aquatic facility will be officially unveiled on Saturday, April 22 during the Zest of the West pool fundraiser hosted by the Big Dippers Fundraising Committee at the WCEC. Council hopes to have the final contract ready for approval by May 8. Fundraising and sponsorship opportunities will also be discussed at that time.

“There is a lot of hard work that has gone into this so far, and I know there will be a lot of hard work yet to come, but this is a significant step forward for the pool project and I’m very pleased,” said Mayor Perkins.
